Types of Medication Review (PCNE)

",simple" Medication Review (Type I)

based on the medication history in the pharmacy




"intermediate" Medication Review (Type II)

- → Based on medication history +patient interview
 - MUR, Polymedikations-Check
 - "Brown Bag"-Methode




"advanced" Medication Review (Type 3)

- medication history +patient interview +clinical data
 - Clinical Medication Review



Types of Medication Review Type II - Split







2a: Based on medication history + patient interview

- MUR, Polymedikations-Check
- "Brown Bag"-Methode

OR

2b: Based on medication history + clinical data

- In hospital pharmacies
- In Dutch community pharmacies




Generic definition

Medication review is an evaluation of a patient's drugs, optimizing the outcome of drug therapy and minimizing the number of drug related problems.



PCNE Working Definition (Dublin 2011)

Medication review is an evaluation of a patient's medicines with the aim of optimizing the outcomes of medicine therapy. This entails identifying the risks, detecting medication-related problems and suggesting solutions. Medication review should be part of the management of medication therapy.

Dutch Guideline - March 2012

Step 1: Pharmacotherapeutic anamnese

Medication overview (pharmacy data)
Patient information
Medical information incl. lab data

Step 2: Pharmacotherapeutic analysis

Step 3: Discussion reviewer-prescriber

about treatment plan (GP and pharmacist)

Step 4: Discussion with patient: establish treatment plan

Step 5: Follow up and Monitoring



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Flow medication review

- Patient selection
- Data collection (= anamnesis)
- The actual review (=analysis)
- Listing the problems & solutions
- Prioritising (= consultation)
- Implementing
- Evaluation
