# Workshop 1: Medication review, bringing the strands together

Aim: To merge the results of previous PCNE Medication Review workshops and create a manual for optimal medication review that can be used in pharmaceutical care projects in different countries.

Workshop 2: How to develop and run collaborative research across disciplines (Facilitators: Maria Cordina, Malta and Tommy Westerlund, Sweden)

A workshop primarily for novices, PhD students and their supervisors Aim: To develop guidance on best practice in designing and conducting interdisciplinary research evaluating interprofessional services.

# Workshop 3: Implementation strategies and their indicators. From research to practice (Facilitators: Charlotte Rossing, Denmark and Allison Roberts, Australia)

A workshop primarily for people who are studying or implementing pharmaceutical care services

Aim: To discuss methods of implementation, and to design indicators for practice that help to study the results of the implementation of new services and interprofessional care formats.

A workshop primarily for people developing and implementing collaborative services and teachers of pharmaceutical care. Aim: To develop a framework and teaching methodologies, and to prepare practitioners to contribute to interprofessional research and practice, so that different professionals will cooperate better in their future.

# More information on the Working Conference

## The workshops

The workshops are a special feature of the PCNE working conferences. They are spread over several days, and typically last 10-14 hours. All conference participants are expected to take part in a workshop. Participants are not expected to change workshop during the conference.

The minimum number of different workshops offered in Berlin is four, the maximum is five. Registrants will be asked to select a first and second choice. Once the workshop has been assigned (by 15<sup>th</sup> January 2013), participants can contact the facilitators if they want to present their own work during the workshop, if relevant to the latter's aim.

### Number of participants in the conference

Due to the limited space in the venue, the maximum number of participants in the working conference is 100.

#### Abstracts and PhD students

All participants are invited to submit an abstract for a poster presentation or oral communication. But PhD students are especially invited to do so. See www.pcne.org for an abstract form and additional information. Abstract authors will be informed about acceptance or rejection of the abstract by December 31, 2012 at the latest. Only the presenting author can still register for an early bird fee till 7<sup>th</sup> January 2013.

#### Accommodation details

The accommodation can already be available before the workshop, or an extra night after the workshop. Additional costs are 55 Euro/night, incl. breakfast.

The working conference ends late on Friday, February 8<sup>th</sup>. Therefore accommodation for that night and breakfast on Saturday morning are included in the registration fee. If a participant wants to leave on Friday evening, a reduction of 30 Euro on the conference fee will be applied.

### **Other related events**

Several other PCNE related events will also be organised on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> and Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> February 2012. PCNE members will be informed separately.

## Social event

Friday evening, 8<sup>th</sup> February 2012, a social event will be organised for a separate fee. The event comprises a guided tour through Berlin, and a dinner in the revolving restaurant of the Berlin television tower (the Spider).

### Travel

All major airlines fly into Berlin, including low-cost carriers such as Easyjet or Ryanair. The conference venue is slightly outside of Berlin, and can only be reached by taxi. Cheap carriers mostly arrive at Tegel, others at Schönefeld. The conference organisers are intending to organise a shuttle service.

### Weather

Weather in Berlin in February usually is rather cold, so do bring a pullover, warm shoes and a winter coat!

## Visas

PCNE will only give out an invitation letter after the registration fee has been paid. If a visa is not granted, PCNE will return the registration fee minus 30 Euro administration costs.

# **Costs and registration**

The price of the full conference, including three nights' accommodation, will be € 850.00. An early bird fee of € 790.00 is available till 1<sup>st</sup> December 2012.

If a participants leaves on Friday evening (rather than Saturday morning), a reduction on the registration fee of  $\leq$  30.00 will be applied.

The costs for the social event on Friday night, including transfer in and out of the city centre, is  $\notin$  90.00
