Airport ->Copenhagen Nørreport

There are very frequent metro trains from Castrup Airport (=Copenhagen) in the direction of Vanløse st. Get off the Metro at Nørreport Station after approx. 15 minutes. (Alternatively you can take an S-train from the airport to Copenhagen central, and find the S-Train to Hillerød there).

Copenhagen Nørreport -> Hillerød

At Nørreport, take the 'Nordbanen', S-train (S-tog) line A or E, to Hillerød. The train has Hillerød as final destination and will reach the town after approx. 10 stops and 45 minutes.
