

Competence versus Performance



Recommendations

- Disseminate competence & performance, concepts & issues to pharmacy stakeholder
- Pharmacists in each country should develop & agree & publish competencies for patient care
- Undergraduate curricula should be assessed to determine extent to which they meet these competency criteria to entry level
- Postgraduate programmes should meet these criteria to attain higher levels of competency and link to continuous quality management programmes and to enable progression to specialist competency
- Research on the assessment of pharmacist competencies and on the transformation of competence into performance in pharmaceutical education, practice and care
