

## Brief Biography Martin Henman, BPharm, MA, PhD, MPSI.

Martin Henman is Associate Professor in the Practice of Pharmacy and Co-ordinator of the Centre for the Practice of Pharmacy in Trinity College Dublin. He practised as a hospital pharmacist before undertaking a PhD in Pharmacology and gaining a Certificate in Health Economics. He was a founder tutor of the Irish Centre for Continuing Pharmaceutical Education. In 2006, Dr Henman was presented with a Provost's Teaching Award for the excellence of his contribution to teaching and learning in Trinity College. He helped publish the first Pharmacy manpower study in Ireland, the first study of Drugs and Therapeutics Committees in the Irish Hospital sector and reported the effect of de-listing OTC medicines from the national prescribing list. He is examining medication use in the elderly (The Irish Longitudinal Study of Ageing - TILDA) and also medicines use and standards in people with Intellectual Disability. Dr Henman was a member of the EAFP Task Force that proposed the introduction of Pharmaceutical Care in the undergraduate syllabus. He is a founder member of Pharmaceutical Care Network Europe and was a participant in the PCNE care of the elderly study and the recent survey of Pharmaceutical Care in Europe. Dr Henman is a Consultant to the Council of Europe, identifying and developing indicators of Pharmaceutical Practice.
